Editor's Comments:

There were a couple of guys who have electrics that did have fail safe turned on, so that if they turned on their receiver before the transmitter, or turned off their transmitter before turning off the receiver, the motor will turn, causing a safety issue.

The article below was copied from an instruction manual for a 'Crazy Wing' electric plane:

!!! WARNING !!! Set the Failsafe

With electric planes, once the motor battery is connected to the ESC, the motor can come on at any time, causing damage or serious injury. If the failsafe is not set and the transmitter is switched off before the motor battery is disconnected, the motor could come on. Review the instructions included with your radio system for setting the failsafe.

Setting the Tactic TR625 receiver failsafe:

- ☐ 1. Switch on the transmitter and connect the motor battery to the ESC.
- 2. Make sure the throttle stick is down.
- ☐ 3. Press and hold the "Link" button on the receiver until the red LED goes out and then release the button, and the red LED

Work still needs to done but I am sure that after spending some time there you will be pleased with the progress.

Treasurers Report:

Field Reports:

Squatrito is in good flying shape. Hardyston is also in good flying shape. Reynolds Field's grass is growing well, has been cut several times, and is progressing on schedule.

Safety:

Check for ticks before you get into your vehicle. Also, there have been bear sightings at Hardyston, so check frequently when flying. The 'buddy' system would be a help while your plane is in the air!

Membership:

No report. New member David Gary was present.

Old Business:

Pat is selling insecticide infused clothing that may help keep tics off you. He passed around brochures with details and took orders for 10+ shirts.

Because of AMA lobbying of the federal government, there is no longer a need to register yourself with the FAA. However, keep your number if you've already register in case this changes in the future.

We have no lease or permit to fly at Squatrito. We have been asked by Josh to leave by July 31st. Pat will try to get this extended into the fall. Please note that we still cannot fly when there is an event scheduled at Waterloo.

New Business:

Ron Zielensky and Frank Costello will refurbish and install the old frequency board at Reynolds field.

Please also note that when the President is in Bedminster, we cannot fly because our fields are all located within the 30-mile restricted area. A NOTEM is always sent when this occurs, but since many members do not receive this official NOTEM emails, Anthony will send out notices when future restrictions occur.

should come back on.

□ 4. Check the failsafe operation.

To arm the motor, the throttle stick must be in the down position.

If the throttle stick is not, the motor will beep.

Once the throttle stick is moved to the down position the motor is ready to run.

With the transmitter switched on and the motor battery connected, move the throttle stick so that the motor is running slowly.

Switch off the transmitter and the motor will stop if the failsafe is set correctly.

If it does not stop, repeat the failsafe setting up procedure.

Treasurer's Report: June, 2017

June's opening balance was \$15,779.14. Collections for the month totaled \$14.00, represented by the June Fifty / Fifty. Expenses for the month totaled \$771.56, represented by: Mowing \$745, and Hardyston field Maintenance \$26.56. The result of the above is an ending balance of \$15,021.58.

After repairing the road in Hardyston, there was \$353 remaining from the original reserve. With the club's approval here tonight, I have reallocated this balance to the Reynolds Field reserve.
