Since we have scheduled May 5th for a dedication of Reynolds Field along with the celebration of the 50th year of the club's existence, perhaps we will want to do another event later on in August besides the field dedication. Please give it some thought.

At the recent AMA Expo East, we saw a number of great looking aircraft that really made you want to get ready for the coming season. Let's see what has been going on with our members as they get ready for 2019.

Membership:

We have a membership drive till May. We are accepting applicants new to the hobby or applicants new to the area that do not belong to another club. Dues were collected in January. Old Business:

FAA – Due to the fact that the Government was closed, all FAA Drone certificates were extended till 2020.

Lease – Tony and Pat signed a lease for Reynolds Field and Tony is putting together all of the documents required for the agreement.

Field Grant – The deadline for the AMA Field Grant is March 1st. Pat and Tony are putting together documents to get a \$750 grant from the AMA (10% of the \$7500 spent so far on the field in the past year).

New Business:

We discussed having some sort of event in August. The same weekend we had the District II last year. More next month.

We discussed the availability of Trinca Airport. Pat tried to get the AMA interested in leasing it.

Tony asked for volunteers for flight training at Reynolds. Tony read from an ad he put in the newsletter.

<u>Inclement Weather:</u> Tony will send out an email before 5pm on the day of the meeting or the night before if the forecast is certain. Be smart, if the weather is bad where you live, don't drive.
