President's Comments - March 2019

Our past meeting in March was a very good one, with a number of members attending. We discussed a number of issues, including a fun fly in August. The question of having the fun fly was raised from the floor with the majority of members agreeing that we should hold an event during the week of August 25th and 26th. I was asked to contact Green township to see if the field was available and if so, file for a sanction. I checked and it is available, but when I filed for the sanction, I found that Bridgewater R/C had taken the date for a single day Warbirds fun fly. The event is about 26 miles from Trinca, and we would not have been able to get the sanction. At this point, I would suggest we pass for this year and take steps further into the year to protect this date for 2020.

I have spoken with Eric Williams of the AMA, and he has advised me they are putting on a big push with the FAA to get some kind of resolution on the temporary stand downs due to the President's presence at Bedminster. I will keep you informed as to any progress on this matter and will discuss it further at our next meeting.

Even better was our end-of-meeting discussion on modeling, and a promise from Gary to discuss batteries used in electric powered models, as well as associated issues such as speed controllers, motors, battery maintenance and battery selection. Please bring pencil and paper for notes; we will have a test afterwards. This was the fun part of the meeting, and we had a lot of fun talking about various modeling questions and various "how-to's".

Secretary's Report – March 2019 Meeting Minutes

As mentioned in last month's newsletter, a field grant for \$750 has been applied for to the AMA for our work in developing Reynold's Field.

The club is incorporated; the state requires paperwork filing regarding the corporation.

New Business:

We discussed having some sort of event in August on the same weekend we had the District fun fly previously. The District II fun fly is in New York state this year. Trinca Field would be the choice for our event Pat will check for its availability. The decision will be made at the next meeting. It was agreed that
