President Comments by Pat Rizzuto

I thought I would depart from my normal comments and highlight a subject which may be afflicting some of our members. No, I meant to say afflicting because that is what indeed may be happening. For the past 2-3 three years my flying time has steadily been decreasing to what is now no flight time at all this year except counting once or twice when Mike let me fly his plane in small circles over the field while he stood next to me. The problem was I could not see the airplane clearly and the field of vision was very hazy. This problem grew worse over time and even new glasses could not correct the problem.

The problem that I had and maybe many of you have encountered is cataracts. It is an eye condition affecting the lens of the eye brought on primarily by age although cases encountered in your late twenties are seen more than occasionally. The lens becomes cloudy restricting the passage of light to the retina. The progression of the condition is very gradual and is easily diagnosed by your ophthalmologist or optometrist. But because the progression was so insidious it seemed like I was losing flying skills but really, I could not see the aircraft and was losing my depth perception, hence some rather hard landings at a high rate of speed.

If you are bothered by hazy vision especially on overcast days, twinkling headlights of oncoming cars, loss of depth perception and the inability to comfortably focus on distant objects you may have cataracts. The good news is that cataracts are readily treatable with minor surgery paid for by insurance with downtime of no more than two days. When I was evaluated, my surgeon told me that the improvement in one eye would be 100% and the other eye 95%. The surgery is done on two separate dates on an outpatient basis usually lasting about 3-4 hours. Please contact your ophthalmologist if you have any of these symptoms, don't let this condition ruin your fun in the sky.
