

Building a Model Airplane

Back in the 1900's, you built R/C planes from balsa and plywood in some areas. Later on you added light plywood and carbon fiber. Then, came the era of fiberglass with plywood formers. As of late, you got a mixture of all three depending on the size and purpose. Oh wait, I forgot to include various types of foam.

Well, Jack Scancarella embraced the newer technology for building R/C airplanes -3D printing. Last year he brough in some small parts he made with the printer and mentioned that he was working on a 3D printer helicopter. He also mentioned that he is going to print a plane. Well that he did and he brought both to our April meeting.

The cost of printing the plane is rather inexpensive. A roll costing \$40 is about all you need. The plans another \$20. Time to print is another story. I believe Jack mentioned that it took over 72 hours. Assemble is time consuming with a lot of trial and error.

Picture below is a Phantom II that Jack printed. The plans call for a 80 to 90 EDF. Jack plans on putting in a 90 EDF with a 6S LIPO. Calculating the weight and the thrust of the EDF, Jack hopes to achieve a 1 to 1 ration. Jack will install electric retracks and simulated after burners. I can't wait to see it fly.
