STEM Update by Frank Fanelli

STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Math) is an increasingly familiar and important educational initiative in middle and high schools. One of the more popular aspects in its broad scope is aviation, from modeling to full scale.

Thinking that getting involved in it might help increase the diminishing club membership led me to propose an aviation themed STEM program in a local school, the Franklin Borough close to the Hardyston field. So I met with the principal, J.R. Giachhi, and the STEM teacher, Laura Roberts, in late Spring last year to pitch the program and its scope.

They enthusiastically endorsed it and after some planning it was scheduled to begin in the second and third trimester for the eighth grade. So far it looks like there will be 60 students in all. It will run for 2 weeks each trimester and will entail simple aerodynamic theory and experiments; paper airplanes; simple free-flight gliders and propeller models; radio control instruction; quadcopters; culminating in a field trip. A potential site includes Sussex Airport. That's a brief outline and I'm asking for the club's support in the following ways: back issues of Model Aviation and/or Model Airplane News; or perhaps donating a retired RC trainer type aircraft.

The flying portion of the program will mostly take place in either the large gym in the school or the football field at the side of the school building. There's ample space in each for the free-flight stuff and small, slow flying RC ships since the Franklin school was once K-12 and the gym size is more than ample.

Hopefully the kids' involvement may pique the interest of some parents, as well as the kids, and bring new members into the club. The academic part of the program could be followed by a broader instruction period at the Hardyston field--only because it's just a few miles from Franklin--during the late Spring and through the Summer.

This may be the opportunity for any one of the kids to discover an interest that leads to a career in aviation or a hobby in modeling. There certainly have been some notable people that climbed the rungs of modeling into illustrious careers, flying, designing, or maintaining aircraft. Who knows, it may lead to another Hoot Gibson or Sean Tucker or Burt Rutan.

Since I wrote this, I'm just completing the second trimester program and will continue it in late April for the third trimester. The kids have enjoyed it and learned some basic things about aircraft. I've proposed an RC demo at the Hardyston field in early June and flight training for any kids or parents with interest during the summer. This is an investment in the club's future so I hope you can support it in any way you can or even get involved.
